Phillis Wheatley | Poetry Foundation Two of the greatest influences on Phillis Wheatley's thought and poetry were the Bible and 18th-century evangelical Christianity; but until fairly recently Wheatley's critics did not consider her use of biblical allusion nor its symbolic application as a statement against slavery.
